ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER

2020 - 00032

WHEREAS, the Governor of the State of Arizona declared a statewide emergency due to concerns for the spread of the COVID-19 virus; and

WHEREAS, to protect the health and safety of all participants by limiting in-person contact as much as possible, the Chief Justice of the Arizona Supreme Court entered Administrative Order No. 2020-60 that provides any court rule that impedes a judge's or court clerk's ability to use available technologies to eliminate or limit in-person contact in the conduct of court business is suspended through May 1, 2020, except such suspension is subject to constitutional requirements.

IT IS ORDERED, in an existing Superior Court case which is currently not subject to mandatory e-filing, any document not requiring a clerk's signature and/or seal at the time of filing may be filed by email as an attachment in PDF format. Any form of order submitted with the email filing shall be in Word format. The document shall be deemed as filed when the email is received by the Clerk of the Superior Court.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the Clerk of the Superior Court shall file the emailed document together with a copy of the email to which the document(s) was attached. The document shall be deemed an original document when filed by the Clerk of the Superior Court.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the Clerk of the Superior Court shall email a conformed copy to the party who initially emailed the document(s). The party initially emailing the document(s), not the Clerk, shall be responsible for service.
