Court Volunteer Program

In 2014 the Supreme Court of Arizona's Chief Justice adopted a strategic agenda called *"Advancing Justice Together: Courts and Communities."* He noted, *"Our courts can provide timely and accessible justice only if they have adequate resources and other public support, including the many volunteers who serve ..."*

To advance that objective, under the leadership of the Presiding Judge, the Superior Court established strategic priorities in 2017. Included in these strategic priorities was a focus on customer support and accessibility as well as public outreach.

Ensuring access to the Court requires providing better information services to Court visitors. As a result, the Court created a Volunteer Information Officer program.

QUALIFICATIONS

- Pass a background check
- Ability to work with court visitors in stressful situations
- Ability to stand, sit and/or walk for prolonged periods of time

DUTIES

- Provide public services information upon request
- Provide directions for courtrooms or offices located within the courthouse
- Provide courtroom calendar information

COMMITMENT

- Volunteers are asked to commit to one year of service
- Volunteers are assigned to four hour shifts on a pre-determined schedule Monday through Friday
- Volunteers must work a minimum of one shift per week
