Assists judicial decision making by providing pre-trial and presentence investigations to the court and improves public safety by facilitating positive behavior change in offenders through effective community-based supervision.

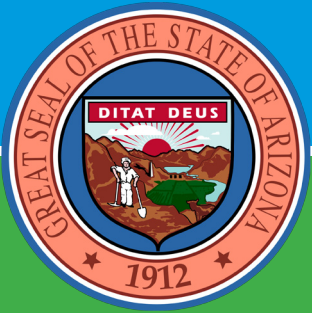
